

What is Portage?

Portage is a home visiting education service for preschool children with additional support needs and their families.

We work with pre school children aged 0 – 5 yrs living in Barking and Dagenham.

The team are based at Alibon Children Centre and are an early intervention service within the Children and Young People with Disability (CYPD) Service.



Who can receive Portage?



- Children aged 0 5 years living in Barking & Dagenham, who have:
- A diagnosed disability which is/may cause significant and/or long-lasting delay in their development;
- Babies born very prematurely before 32 weeks and/or had a long stay in hospital which is/may cause significant and/or long-lasting delay in their development;
- Significant and long-lasting delays in 2 or more areas of development which hasn't improved with support from universal and targeted support (e.g. health visiting service, Community Hubs, attending nursery, Early Help) Barking & Dagenham

Who can refer a child to Portage?



A child can be referred by:

- Health Visitor or Community Nursery Nurse
- Paediatrician
- Speech and Language therapist
- Nursery
- Early Help worker or Social Worker
- Family



How can I refer a child to Portage?

- Discuss with parents and gain their consent to make the referral.
- Complete the online referral form: <u>Portage Referral Form | One Borough Voice (lbbd.gov.uk)</u>
- If you are also referring the child to specialist health services e.g. Speech and Language, physiotherapy and have completed a Single Point of Access (SPA) form, please attach this to the referral.
- Ensure you provide information about the child's level of development and what support the family have had e.g. attending universal groups, support from community nursery nurse with activities.

A Portage Practitioner is allocated for a block of home learning sessions to teach the family evidence-based interventions to support their child's development.

Portage and nursery work together to support the child to start nursery. Reports are shared and visits are carried out to observe the child in the nursery and ensure their needs are being met.




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The Portage model
