Purpose of SENARP Home Support (SHS)

SENARP Home Support was founded in response to the growing number of autistic children.

SHS provides crucial support and interventions to families with autistic children.

SHS serves as a vital resource in improving the quality of life for both children and families.

SHS implements strategies within home environments for families to:

- Develop skills and resilience to effectively support the child
- Provide a deep understanding of early intervention strategies
- Successfully assist and nurture their autistic child or children

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Families receive hands-on training in the familiar dynamics of their homes and with their child/children present.

During the initial visit, collaborative efforts with the parents/caregivers lead to the identification of specific targets.

All the necessary resources are provided.

AREAS OF SUPPORT

Primary School Children 12 weeks support Main Areas of Support

MODEL OF INTERVENTIONS

TEACCH (Teaching, Expanding, Appreciating, Collaborating, Cooperating, Holistic)

- Designed to address the unique needs of individuals with autism
- Utilizes the most effective evidence-based methods available for education and fostering autonomy
- TEACCH is not a single rigid method but can instead complement and work with other approaches.

SCERTS (Social Communication, Emotional Regulation, and Transactional Support)

- An educational framework designed to support autistic children and their families
- Provides specific guidelines to help children develop into confident social communicators
- Encourages collaboration among families, educators, and therapists as a cohesive team
